

**Antioch High School**  
**Standard School Attire 2009-2010**

Antioch High School maintains a professional learning environment. Standard School Attire is an important part of being a good student and learning valuable employability skills.

**Shirt options:**

All shirts must be “polo” style with a collar. Shirts must be a solid color. Color options are white or any shade of blue. Each of the small schools will have logo shirts (orange, grey, green, and black) available for purchase. These shirts are also acceptable. Shirts must cover the midriff. If the shirt extends past the top of the pant pockets, it must be tucked in. Sweaters or vests that are solid blue or white may be worn over a polo shirt. No sweatshirts allowed over polo shirts.

Dresses and jumpers must be a solid white, blue, black, or khaki color and extend to finger tip length. Jumpers must be worn with a polo style shirt.

**Bottom options:**

Skirts and shorts that extend to finger tip length and casual dress pants are allowed in the following colors: khaki, navy, and black. Denim jeans in any color are not allowed.

**Identification:**

Every student is issued an ID badge at the beginning of the school year. The ID badge is a part of SSA and must be worn at all times while in the building. Replacement badges cost \$5.

**Not allowed:**

Jeans, hats, torn clothing, inappropriate language/pictures on clothing, chains attached to the pants, bulky or over-sized coats/jackets, any apparel that can be considered gang-related (bandanas, belts, necklaces/bracelets, etc.), slippers, sagging pants, and hoods worn on the head.

**School Spirit Fridays:**

On Fridays, students may wear Antioch sanctioned spirit wear. These are shirts (including t-shirts) and sweat suits that have been purchased through Antioch or printed with Antioch’s permission. If a student does not wish to participate in wearing spirit wear, then the above SSA rules still apply. Jeans are still not allowed unless otherwise notified by the administration.

**Consequences:**

If the student can fix the SSA infraction, then the teacher will enact the following consequences:

- 1<sup>st</sup> offense – warning
- 2<sup>nd</sup> offense – contact parent and teacher intervention
- 3<sup>rd</sup> offense – teacher team meeting to complete a behavior intervention plan and teacher intervention
- 4<sup>th</sup> offense – referral to the principal

If the student is not in compliance or cannot fix the SSA infraction, the parent will be notified to pick up the child. If the parent cannot be reached, the child will be placed in in-school suspension and the parent will be notified of the consequences.
